Gravetye Estate sits a few miles south of East Grinstead, within the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, less than 10 minutes by car from the town centre.

William Robinson Gravetye Charity owns and manages the estate and aims to welcome walking visitors and to improve biodiversity for Sussex wildlife.

There are two well marked trails that wind through ancient and managed woodland and alongside a tranquil lake. Parking is free of charge, all that we ask in return is that you follow our simple Code of Conduct, including keeping dogs on a lead around the lake.

We want more people to learn about the wild gardener William Robinson (1838-1935), who lived and worked at Gravetye Manor for 50 years, and gifted the estate to the nation.
